

# LOCH RANNOCH FISHING 2023

The Season runs from the 15<sup>th</sup> of March to the 6<sup>th</sup> of October 2021, inclusive.

Permits are issued by the Loch Rannoch Conservation Association via the following means:

**It is a requirement under law to be in possession of a permit before you commence fishing.**

Loch Rannoch is located West of Kinloch Rannoch and permits are valid where the bank can be

accessed between the hydro at the East end of Loch Rannoch to the Bridge at Bridge of Gaur at the

West end of Loch Rannoch. The ticket is valid for bank fishing and boat fishing and does not cover

any tributary or stream which enters the Loch.



Prices: Day tickets are £10, weekly permits are £30. Phone to enquire about a Season Permit.

Concessions are for U16s only, but we do offer discounts for group bookings of 10 or more.

Regulations

1. It is illegal to fish without a permit.

2. Permits are valid for Trout, Charr, Perch and Pike Fishing only.
3. Permits are valid for the named person, for the period stated and is for one rod.
4. Trout under 9 inches in length must be returned to the water unharmed. Only two trout per person per day is allowed.
5. Use of live bait is forbidden. Dead bait must be Salt-water species only.
6. Boat launch is by permit only, subject to agreement of the Water Warden.
7. The issue of a permit does not grant access rights, where such rights do not exist under any current legislation.
8. Bank or boat fishing only, no wading.
9. The issuer will not be liable for any loss, damage or injury arising through the exercise of an entitlement conferred by this permit.
